This summary is qualified in its entirety by a pricing supplement (the "Pricing Supplement"), the base shelf prospectus dated March 25, 2022, the program prospectus supplemented March 28, 2022, as supplemented November 11, 2022 and the product prospectus supplement dated March 28, 2022 in respect of index linked securities, as supplemented November 11, 2022.

The Underlying Index is an adjusted return index that aims to track the gross total return performance of the Solactive Canada Utilities Index TR (the "Target Index"), subject to a reduction of a synthetic dividend of 160 index points per annum calculated daily in arrears (the "Adjusted Return Factor"). For the avoidance of doubt, the return on the Securities is linked to the Underlying Index and is not linked to the Target Index. The Closing Level on January 12, 2023 was 3,453.73. The Adjusted Return Factor divided by the Closing Level was therefore equal to 4.633% on January 12, 2023. If an Autocall Redemption Event does not occur, over the term of the Securities, the sum of the Adjusted Return Factor will be approximately 1,120 index points, representing 32.429% of the Closing Level on January 12, 2023. For the calculation of the level of the Target Index, any dividends or other distributions paid on the constituent securities of the Target Index are assumed to be reinvested across all of the constituent securities of the Target Index. As of January 12, 2023, the annual dividend yield on the Target Index was 4.2512%, representing an aggregate dividend yield of approximately 33.8343% compounded annually over the term of the Securities, on the assumption that the dividend yield remains constant. Securities do not represent an interest in the Underlying Index, the Target Index or in the securities of the entities that comprise the Target Index, and holders will have no right or entitlement to such securities including, without limitation, redemption rights (if any), voting rights or rights to receive dividends or other distributions paid on such securities.

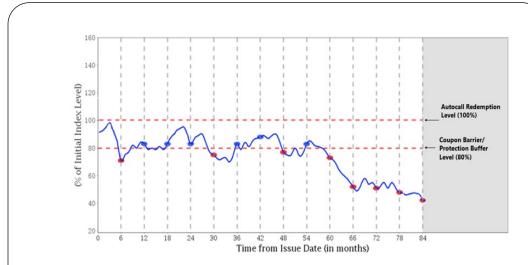

Sample Calculations of Final Redemption Amount or Autocall Redemption Amount and Interest Payments: The examples set out below are included for illustration purposes only. The performance of the Underlying Index used to illustrate the calculation of the Final Redemption Amount or Autocall Redemption Amount and the Interest Payments over the term of the Securities is not an estimate or forecast of the performance of the Underlying Index or the Securities. All examples assume that a holder of the Securities has purchased Securities with an aggregate Principal Amount of \$100 and that no Extraordinary Event has occurred. All examples assume a Buffer of 20.00%, a Gearing Multiplier of 100/80, which is 1.25, a Coupon Barrier Level of 80.00% of the Initial Index Level, a Protection Buffer Level of 80.00% of the Initial Index Level and an Autocall Redemption Level of 100.00% of the Initial Index Level. For convenience, each vertical line in the charts below represents both a hypothetical Observation Date and the next succeeding Interest Payment Date. Certain dollar amounts are rounded to the nearest whole cent.

Example #1: Loss Scenario with Payment on the Maturity Date at Less Than the Principal Amount



- Indicates Observation Dates on which the Coupon Barrier Level is breached; therefore no
 Interest Payment will occur on the related Interest Payment Date.
- Indicates Observation Dates on which there is a Digital Payout Event; therefore an Interest Payment will occur on the related Interest Payment Date.
- Solactive Canada Utilities 160 AR Index

In this scenario, there is no Observation Date on which the Closing Level is at or above the Autocall Redemption Level and, accordingly, the Securities would not be redeemed before the Maturity Date. On the Final Valuation Date, the Final Index Level is below the Protection Buffer Level.

(i) Interest Payments

In this example, there is a Digital Payout Event on 6 of the 14 Observation Dates. On the other 8 Observation Dates, no Digital Payout Event would occur because the Closing Level is below the Coupon Barrier Level. Therefore, the Interest Payment of \$6.40 per Interest Period would be payable for 6 Interest Periods on the applicable Interest Payment Date, for total Interest Payments of:

Principal Amount of Securities × 6.4000% per Interest Period × 6 Interest Periods

 $100 \times 6.4000\% \times 6 = 38.40$

(ii) Final Redemption Amount

In this example, the Initial Index Level is 3,453.73 and the Final Index Level is 1,381.49. Therefore, the Final Redemption Amount would be calculated as follows:

Initial Index Level = 3,453.73

Final Index Level = 1,381.49

Percentage Change = (1,381.49 - 3,453.73) / 3,453.73 = -0.60000 or -60.000%

Since the Final Index Level is below its Protection Buffer Level, the Final Redemption Amount is reduced by the amount of any decline beyond the Buffer multiplied by the Gearing Multiplier and is calculated as follows:

Final Redemption Amount = $\$100.00 + [\$100.00 \times (-60.000\% + 20.00\%) \times 1.25] = \50.00

Therefore, the total amounts payable per Security from the Issue Date to the Maturity Date are:

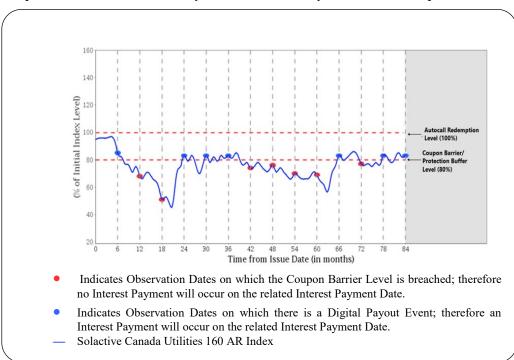
(a) Total Interest Payments: \$38.40

- (b) Final Redemption Amount: \$50.00
- (c) Total amount paid over the term of the Securities: \$88.40

The equivalent annually compounded rate of return in this example is -1.75%.

Sample Calculations: (continued)

Example #2: Gain Scenario with Payment on the Maturity Date at the Principal Amount



In this scenario, there is no Observation Date on which the Closing Level is at or above the Autocall Redemption Level and, accordingly, the Securities would not be redeemed before the Maturity Date. On the Final Valuation Date, the Final Index Level is at or above the Protection Buffer Level.

(i) Interest Payments

In this example, there is a Digital Payout Event on 7 of the 14 Observation Dates. On the other 7 Observation Dates, no Digital Payout Event would occur because the Closing Level is below the Coupon Barrier Level. Therefore, the Interest Payment of \$6.40 per Interest Period would be payable for 7 Interest Periods on the applicable Interest Payment Date for total Interest Payments of:

Principal Amount of Securities × 6.4000% per Interest Period × 7 Interest Periods

$$100 \times 6.4000\% \times 7 = 44.80$$

(ii) Final Redemption Amount

In this example, since the Final Index Level is 2,832.06, which is above the Protection Buffer Level of 80.00% of the Initial Index Level of 3,453.73, being 2,762.98, the Final Redemption Amount per Security is equal to \$100.00.

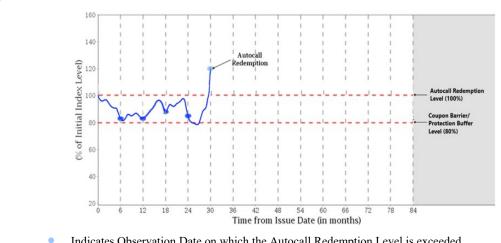
Therefore, the total amounts payable per Security from the Issue Date to the Maturity Date are:

- (a) Total Interest Payments: \$44.80
- (b) Final Redemption Amount: \$100.00
- (c) Total amount paid over the term of the Securities: \$144.80

The equivalent annually compounded rate of return in this example is 5.43%.

Sample Calculations: (continued)

Example #3: Gain Scenario with Autocall Redemption Event



- Indicates Observation Date on which the Autocall Redemption Level is exceeded.
- Indicates Observation Dates on which there is a Digital Payout Event; therefore an Interest Payment will occur on the related Interest Payment Date.
- Solactive Canada Utilities 160 AR Index

In this scenario, the Closing Level is at or above the Autocall Redemption Level on the Observation Date that falls 30 months into the term of the Securities. This would constitute an Autocall Redemption Event and, on the next succeeding Interest Payment Date, the Bank would redeem the Securities.

(i) Interest Payments

In this example, there is a Digital Payout Event on each of the 5 Observation Dates prior to the redemption of the Securities because the Closing Level is at or above the Coupon Barrier Level on each such date. Therefore, the Interest Payment of \$6.40 per Interest Period would be payable for each Interest Period on the applicable Interest Payment Date (including on the Autocall Redemption Date), for total Interest Payments of:

Principal Amount of Securities × 6.4000% per Interest Period × 5 Interest Periods

$$100 \times 6.4000\% \times 5 = 32.00$$

(ii) Autocall Redemption Amount

The Autocall Redemption Amount per Security is equal to \$100.00.

Therefore, the total amounts payable per Security from the Issue Date to the Autocall Redemption Date are:

- (a) Total Interest Payments: \$32.00
- (b) Autocall Redemption Amount: \$100.00
- (c) Total amount paid over the term of the Securities: \$132.00

The equivalent annually compounded rate of return in this example is 11.75%.
