KEY TERMS

Issuer: Royal Bank of Canada

Currency: CAD

Term: Approximately 5.00 years

Underlying Index: Variable return on the Notes (“**Variable Return**”) will be determined by reference to the adjusted returns of the Solactive Canada Utilities 5% AR Index (the “**Underlying Index**”). The Underlying Index is an adjusted return index that aims to track the gross total return performance of the Solactive Canada Utilities Index TR (the “**Target Index**”), subject to a reduction of a synthetic dividend of 5.00% per annum calculated daily in arrears (the “**Adjusted Return Factor**”). **For the avoidance of doubt, the return on the Notes is linked to the Underlying Index and is not linked to the Target Index.** The Notes do not represent an interest in the Underlying Index, the Target Index or in the securities of the entities that comprise the Target Index, and holders will have no right or entitlement to such securities including, without limitation, redemption rights (if any), voting rights or rights to receive dividends or other distributions paid on such securities. The closing level of the Underlying Index on June 15, 2026 was 1,313.80. There is no requirement for Royal Bank to hold any interest in the Underlying Index, the Target Index or in the securities of the entities that comprise the Target Index.

Initial Valuation Date: July 10, 2026

Final Valuation Date: July 10, 2031

Variable Return: The Variable Return, if any, on each Note upon maturity will be an amount equal to:

- if the Percentage Change is greater than or equal to 31.000%, the Principal Amount multiplied by the Booster Amount plus, the Principal Amount multiplied by the Participation Rate multiplied by the Percentage Change in excess of the Booster Amount;
- if the Percentage Change is greater than or equal to 0.000%, but less than 31.000%, then the Principal Amount multiplied by the Booster Amount; or
- if the Percentage Change is negative, then there will be no Variable Return.

The Variable Return, if any, will not be less than zero.

Booster Amount: 31.000%, applied only if the Percentage Change is greater than or equal to 0.000%.

Participation Rate:	The Participation Rate will be equal to 100.000%, applied only if the Percentage Change is greater than or equal to 31.00%.
Credit Rating:	100% principal protection guaranteed by RBC at maturity. RBC is rated Aa1 by Moody's, AA- by Standard and Poor's and AA by DBRS.
Secondary Market:	The Notes are tradeable in a daily secondary market, subject to availability, which RBC Capital Markets will use reasonable efforts to provide as outlined in the Information Statement. Proceeds on sale may be less than the \$100 Principal Amount.
Eligibility for Investment:	RRSPs, RRIFs, TFSAs, FHSAs, RDSPs, RESPs and DPSPs.

SAMPLE CALCULATIONS

The examples set out below are included for illustration purposes only. The levels of the Underlying Index used to illustrate the calculation of the Variable Return are not estimates or forecasts of the level of the Underlying Index on which the Base Level and Settlement Level or the calculation of the Percentage Change, and in turn Variable Return, will depend. All examples assume that a Noteholder has purchased Notes with an aggregate principal amount of \$10,000 and that no Extraordinary Event has occurred.

Example #1 — Hypothetical calculation of the Payment Amount where the Percentage Change of the Underlying Index is positive and greater than or equal to 31.00%. It is assumed that the Base Level of the Underlying Index is 1,313.80 and the Settlement Level of the Underlying Index is 1,970.70 (hypothetical). The Payment Amount would be calculated as follows:

Base Level = 1,313.80

Settlement Level = 1,970.70

Percentage Change = $(1,970.70 - 1,313.80) / 1,313.80 = 0.50000$ or 50.000%

Booster Amount = 31.00%

Participation Rate = 100.00%

Variable Return = $\$10,000.00 \times 31.00\% + [\$10,000.00 \times 100.00\% \times (50.000\% - 31.00\%)] = \$5,000.00$

Payment Amount = $\$10,000.00 + \$5,000.00 = \$15,000.00$

In this example, the Payment Amount provides a return equivalent to an annually compounded rate of return of 8.45%.

Example #2 — Hypothetical calculation of the Payment Amount where the Percentage Change of the Underlying Index is positive but less than 31.00%. It is assumed that the Base Level of the Underlying Index is 1,313.80 and the Settlement Level of the Underlying Index is 1,510.87 (hypothetical). The Payment Amount would be calculated as follows:

Base Level = 1,313.80

Settlement Level = 1,510.87

Percentage Change = $(1,510.87 - 1,313.80) / 1,313.80 = 0.15000$ or 15.000%

Booster Amount = 31.00%

Variable Return = $\$10,000.00 \times 31.00\% = \$3,100.00$

Payment Amount = $\$10,000.00 + \$3,100.00 = \$13,100.00$

In this example, the Payment Amount provides a return equivalent to an annually compounded rate of return of 5.55%.

Example #3 — Hypothetical calculation of the Payment Amount where the Percentage Change of the Underlying Index is negative. It is assumed that the Base Level of the Underlying Index is 1,313.80 and the Settlement Level of the Underlying Index is 919.66 (hypothetical). The Payment Amount would be calculated as follows:

Base Level = 1,313.80

Settlement Level = 919.66

Percentage Change = $(919.66 - 1,313.80) / 1,313.80 = -0.30000$ or -30.000%

Payment Amount = $\$10,000.00 + \$0.00 = \$10,000.00$

In this example, the Payment Amount provides a return equivalent to an annually compounded rate of return of 0.00%.
